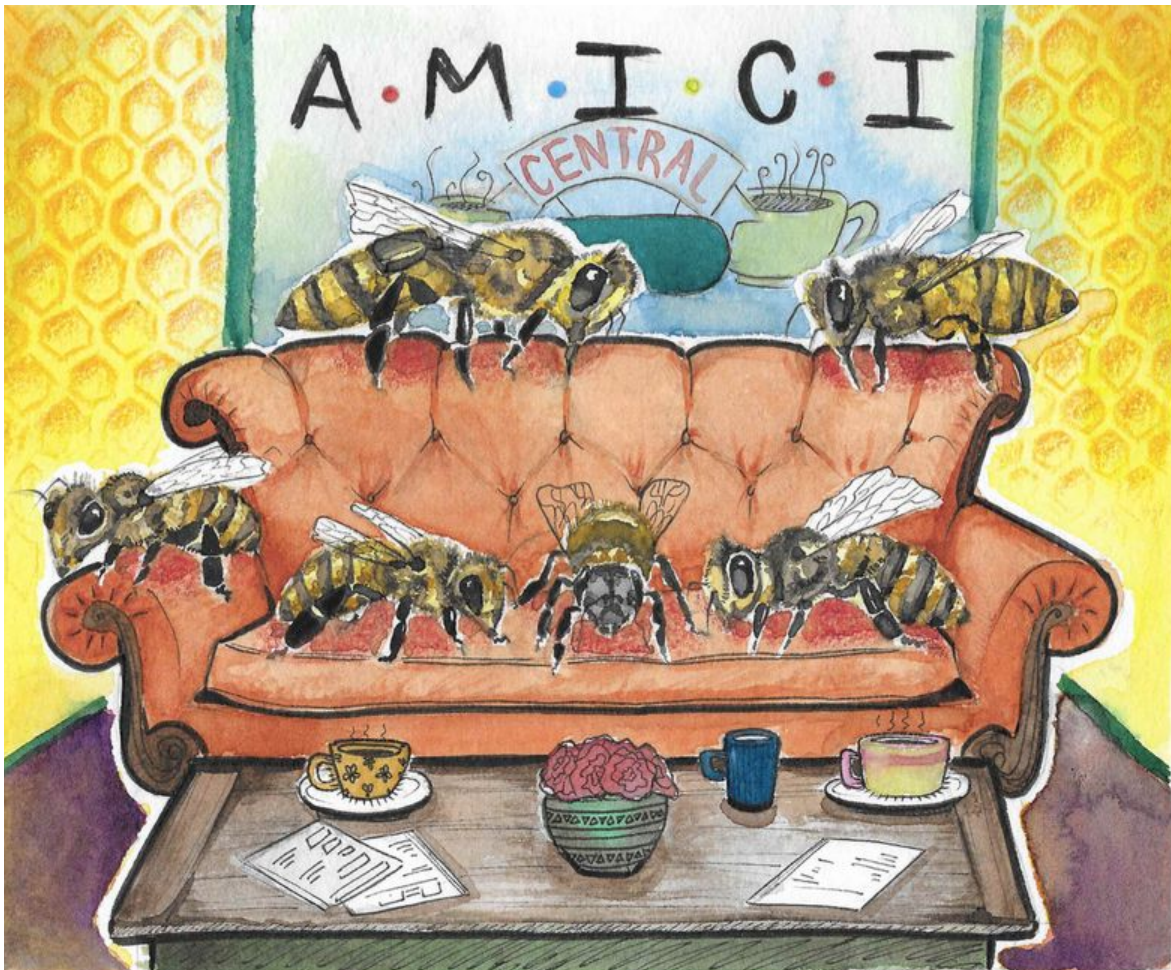

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## CONVENTION REGISTRATION AND COSTS

### Registration Process

1. Begin the registration process by registering your chapter using CAJCL's online database at <https://n344.fmphost.com/fmi/webd#CJCL-Database> (Access codes are the same that were used to process your CAJCL Chapter Membership.) If you are new to CAJCL, contact Martha Altieri at [statechair@cajcl.org](mailto:statechair@cajcl.org).
  - a. An email will be sent to the sponsor to confirm the chapter's registration and to provide a link and instructions for Adult Registration.
  - b. A separate email will be sent to the sponsor with an attached Excel workbook and instructions for Student Registration.
2. The registration process is different for adults and students. Delegates will **NOT** register online.
  - a. The Sponsor, other sponsors/teachers, and chaperones must register online using the link received in the confirmation email (1a). Adults must also complete the Medical and Waiver forms and return to the School Sponsor.
  - b. Delegates will use the Activities Sheet (provided in the convention packet) to record their information and test/contest selections. Students will return the Activities Sheet and payment to the sponsor/Latin teacher.
  - c. All students and adults will return the Medical and Waiver forms to the Sponsor.
3. The sponsor will manage Delegate Registration by completing the Excel workbook (1b) that lists all student delegates, their information, and some test/contest selections. **The completed Activities Sheets will provide the information needed to complete the Excel worksheet.** You should NOT send the completed Activities sheets to the host school. They are yours to use as you will.
  - a. You can print an Invoice from the workbook (third tab).
  - b. You can print a list of your student delegates from workbook (fourth tab).

### Convention Costs

Registration fee is \$100 per student and \$40 per adult (except SCL not acting as official chaperones) outside the 1 adult : 12 students ratio. Note that 13 students entitles a school to 2 free chaperones. Cost includes Friday dinner and Saturday breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Additionally, **a ratio of at least one adult per twelve students is required.**

An event of this size requires pre-payments for meals, facilities, security, and other items based on the number of students and adults registered. Thus, refunds will not be made if student delegates are unable to attend. "Substitutions" may be made **on/before March 22, 2019**; please contact Matt Davis (convention host sponsor) at (925) 297-7603 by phone or text.

Only teams who qualify at CARCER may participate in Competitive Certamen at State. CARCER will be held at Acalanes Adult Center for Northern California and University High School, Irvine for Southern California on **February 23, 2019**, from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Ladder of play for the regional competitions will be decided according to the number of teams registered. ## DRESS CODE

## **FELLOWSHIPS**

**Friday Night:** Fellowship is optional by school. Fellowship locations will be each school's testing location. Friday night fellowship is a chance for schools to gather and discuss the day's events, as well as prepare for Saturday.

**Saturday Afternoon (Voting):** Fellowship is **mandatory** for all students to vote on the candidates and amendments. The two voting students from each chapter must bring the results to the Parliamentarian in the Convention Headquarters.

## **ACTIVITIES**

### **Pre-Convention Contests (see White Booklet for contest rules)**

All delegates are allowed to enter modern myths, poems, and slogans before convention to be judged against other delegates in California of the same Latin level. A modern myth must be an original myth meant to explain the existence of some phenomenon in nature or in modern culture, an existing classical myth adapted to fit modern times, or an original myth centered around existing classical figures. Poetry must be based on this year's JCL theme and must be in English, but are not limited to any specific meter or verse. Slogans should advertise JCL and can be written in either English or Latin. Students can enter a maximum of ONE modern myth, ONE poem, and TWO slogans; all entries must be postmarked by **March 2nd, 2019** and sent to:

### ***Major Events\*:***

**Academic Testing** - If you're looking to escape from the doldrums of day-to-day school, come to convention and take tests that are enjoyable! Select from a wide variety of tests and then get awards for being smarter than the other Latin nerds.

**Catapult** - Do you get in trouble for throwing things in class? We won't tell you not to! We encourage you to fling water balloons, beanbags, and plushies with your chapter catapult! Not a troublemaker? Then apply what you learned in physics and help build a powerful siege engine. Come bombard the Miramonte fields with an onslaught from your mighty onager!

**Chariot** - Ever wonder what it was like to be one of the essedarii (charioteers) of ancient Rome? If so, you have that opportunity in our chariot races! Construct a chariot with your chapter and bring it to convention where you will compete against other chapters' chariots. It's not the Circus Maximus...but hey! All important things began small!

**Dramatic Interpretation** - Are you an aspiring thespian? Do you understand the woes of those you have come to love through translation? Dramatic Interpretation is perfect for you! Act out a pre-memorized passage and impress the judges with your heartfelt rendition of an ancient scene.

**English Oratory** - There's nothing quite as well understood as a speech. Prepare a three minute oration on the convention theme (bees are not of a solitary nature) and be evaluated on delivery, memorization, adherence to classical theme, and other criteria found in the White Book.

**Essay** - Do you love to write? Do you wish to express your knowledge of the English language and the Classical world? Then Essay is for you! The best way to flaunt your style is a well-worded response to our engaging prompts on demand!

**Graphic Arts** - One of the most beautiful events at convention, graphic arts consists of beautiful art in various media prepared before convention. **NB: Make sure to look at the White Booklet restrictions!** There's nothing more sad than disqualifying beautiful art because it didn't follow the rules.

**Latin Oratory** - Follow the footsteps of Cicero and other great Roman speakers by expatiating (or ranting) a selected passage (in Latin, of course). Violent hand motions and extremely dramatic pauses are highly encouraged, along with preparation and memorization. Who knows - you might be destined to become a famous Roman politician and vehemently denounce a traitor to the republic!

**Latin Sight Reading** - *Si hoc legere scis, illud tibi faciendum est.* Show your ability to pronounce a passage you've never seen before. It's more fun than it sounds, and great way to be exposed to new authors.

**Open Certamen** - Do you love Roman history? Mythology? Latin in general? Open Certamen is the event for you! It's a great way to have fun while testing your knowledge of Latin, and you might even meet new friends from all over the state of California. You've probably seen those teams from your school preparing hard for competitive Certamen, but you don't have to cram all those facts into your head to enjoy the competition. Just come over to Open Certamen, it'll be a blast!

**Sports Olympika** - This year's convention will have a multitude of sports offered such as swimming, track and field, volleyball, ultimate frisbee, and more! Make sure you bring the required equipment; eg, a swimsuit for swimming.
