- I. Call to Order – August Briggs opened the third meeting of the CAJCL Executive Board for the 2023-2024 term at 9:06 am.**
- II. Minutes from 1/20/24 Meeting – Margot Rodgers read the minutes from the second CAJCL board meeting.** Felix moved to approve the minutes. Yoyo seconded. The motion passed.
- III. Reimbursement Requests – Lisa Masoni**
 - a. Ms. Masoni reminded new officers that position-related expenditures must be voted on and approved at board meetings. If they spend money between board meetings, they should contact her and the state chair to gain pre-approval. She then called for reimbursement requests.
 - i. Yoyo asked if she would get reimbursed for her NJCL registration. She would, via a [REIMBURSEMENT FORM](#). CAJCL covers the cost for the state chairs and the 2nd VP to attend NJCL. This includes registration and flight.
 - ii. Ms Alimento asked for \$20 for scholarship folders.
 - b. Felix moved to approve the reimbursement requests. Margot seconded. The motion passed.
- IV. Introductions of Officers, Sponsors, & Committee Members –** When prompted, each

incoming and outgoing officer, committee member, and SCL member introduced themselves and participated in an icebreaker of naming a favorite mythological being or an historical figure.

V. **Officer Reports**

August Briggs (Jesuit) – 2nd Vice President

- a. August began by checking in with the board about spirit. He called for comments in the chat.
- b. He reported that the service project went well. Dr. Briggs asked him to send photos from the service project to Felix for the *Nuntius*, Mia for the Scrapbook, Jon for social media.

Franziska Kungys (St. Francis) – Northern Representative: Franziska reported on finances from Ludi.

- i. The total income at Ludi was \$12,210, including money from the snack bar.
- ii. The total profit minus the snack bar profits was \$10,094, excluding maintenance and security costs.
- iii. They are donating: the \$800 they made from the snack bar to Operation Blessing; \$2,000 from the profit to the JCL scholarship fund (they have put in a financial request); \$2,000 from the profit to the St. Francis scholarship fund.
- iv. Part of the profit was used to pay registration for Convention for two Latin students who couldn't afford the fee.

Mr. Muth (Loyola) – SCRAMULUM Representative

- a. For a SCRAM recap, see 1/20/24 minutes.
- b. The profit was \$3,100, and they plan to make a donation to CAJCL.
- c. Ms Alimento said this hasn't happened yet from the previous SCRAM, but it will.

Patrick Galligan and Jackson Coleman (Menlo School) – Convention Presidents

- a. Patrick said Convention was a great success! Both presidents thanked all faculty and CAJCL members for their time and effort.
 - i. The income was \$100,343.83. Of that, expenses were \$93,042.74. The total profit was \$7,301.06.
 - ii. Reports will come out soon on specifics for each event.
- b. Mr. Davis thanked Jackson and Patrick for their work and the rest of the Convention crew, including Ms. Vasquez and Ms. Jordt.
 - i. He mentioned Miramonte never got billed for janitorial services. He asked if Menlo school paid for anything.
 - ii. Ms. Jordt said the school covered the cost of security and janitorial services, and Ms. Vasquez added that they used supplies from Menlo

instead of having to purchase new ones.

- c. Ms. Masoni said that her students loved the workshops. She also asked about a reimbursement request for graphic arts. Ms. Jordt will follow up on this reimbursement with the business office. She will send a check to Ms Vasquez as soon as Mrs. Vasquez sends her her new address.
- d. Another service Menlo CAJCL did not pay for was a tech person
- e. Kevin said the tech person was fantastic from the SCL perspective.
- f. Ms. Alimanto thanked Ms. Jordt for calmly directing delegates around the campus during colloquia and dinner.
- g. Ms. Curcio remarked that having a student leading the JCL song helped with cohesion, and said it was the best presentation of the song in many years!

Vivienne Arndt (Miramonte) – 1st Vice President

- a. After the last meeting, Vivienne sent an email to all CAJCL chapters detailing how to create a publicity portfolio.
 - i. She hopes this helped to increase pre-Convention participation. She judged 4 great portfolios and announced results at Convention.
 - ii. She also contacted Jon Gumz to post Instagram reminders about publicity.
- b. She wants to reach out to Sophia and feature the top winners on the website. Mr. Davis agreed.
- c. She will encourage those schools to submit their publicity to Nationals.

Yoyo Li (Sage Hill) – Parliamentarian

- a. Yoyo made the decision to focus on increasing candidates instead of making amendments.
 - i. Every office had multiple applicants, which made the election more exciting.
 - ii. There were no states-of-emergency declared.
- b. Voting delegates turned out in record large numbers since Covid. There were a lot of people at the open forum.
 - i. There were a total of 25 voting schools out of 37 attending schools, which made up more than half of schools at Convention.
 - ii. The election was successful.
- c. Ms. Vasquez asked if we have historical stats of how many schools or delegates have voted in past years. Yoyo will look for this information.

Margot Rodgers (St. Ignatius) – Secretary

- a. Margot reported that she published the January minutes to the board, and Sophia put them on the website.
- b. She published her second edition of VESTIS in the upcoming *Nuntius*.
- c. She recorded minutes for Convention GA I, GA II, and GA III. Felix asked for the GA minutes to cross-reference for the *Nuntius*.

- d. She reinforced the importance of the checklist on the minutes and thanked the board for following through with that list. Mr. Davis agreed.
- e. Dr. Briggs suggested in future the minutes be posted in a more prominent spot on the website.

Mia DaPonte (St. Francis) – Historian

- a. Mia suggested the next Historian make a pamphlet to send to school sponsors alerting chapter Historians about nationals publicity for next year.
- b. The CAJCL scrapbook is in great shape and she will submit it to the National competition by June 1st.
- c. Dr. Briggs asked if we had access to comments from last year. Ms. Jordt will make sure Mia has these comments.

Felix Chen (Harker) – Nuntius Editor

- a. Felix reported that he wrote an update for the NJCL torch, and that submissions are due May 18th.
- b. He will redo the first and second issues of the California *Nuntius* before submitting them to Nationals.
- c. He presented the Spring *Nuntius*. .
 - i. He asked Kevin to send him the updated SCL board for 2025. Kevin said there was a vacancy with the VP position, but it will be filled this month.
 - ii. Patrick and Jackson need to add a paragraph on stats to their Convention President letter.
 - iii. Felix asked for a full board picture. August mentioned Yoyo took selfies at Convention. Ms. Vasquez said a former parent took both stills and vidoe at Convention. Ms. Jordt put the link in the chat.
 - iv. Regarding the awards, MS Mixed tennis had two categories of winners, which Mr. Muth identified as mixed singles and mixed doubles.
 - v. He asked to know scholarship awardees.
 - vi. Ms. Vasquez suggested he put in some videos because of the flexible format of a digital magazine. Felix responded that he would see if Joomag could do that.

August called for a break. 10:10 everybody back.

Sophia Vourakis (Harvard West-Lake) – Webmaster

- a. Sophia updated the website as needed for events.
 - i. She published the minutes under the Board section.
 - ii. She also updated the Constitution and bylaws from two years ago.
 - iii. She resolved email issues for the board.
 - iv. She posted Convention announcements and took them down after Convention.

- v. She will put photos from Felix that are not in the *Nuntius* on the website.
- vi. She published the *Nuntius* on the website.
- b. Vivienne should email her about slides on the website for Nationals winners.

Trisha Iyer (Harker) – NJCL Historian

- a. Trisha has been meeting with the NJCL board every month to promote NJCL, and her role is to promote transparency between National and State JCL.
- b. National Classics week just happened, and she hopes that some CAJCLers were able to be a part of the program.
- c. She held a colloquium on Nationals at Convention.
 - i. She saw a great turnout, and attendees were enthusiastic. She shared stories about Nationals and showed a preview of the scrapbook.
 - ii. The colloquium was effective in promoting NJCL. Afterwards she shared information with teachers on how to register, etc.
- d. She is happy to hear CAJCL is submitting to Nationals.
- e. She commended Felix’s blurb for the *Nuntius* about National Convention.
- f. The National scrapbook is going well, and she will have time to work on it after her graduation towards the end of June.

VI. State Chair Report – Matt Davis

- a. Mr. Davis began by thanking the officers, the presidents, and the committee for their commitment to JCL. He commended the efforts made on publicity and the minutes, which are instrumental to keep the organization going.
- b. He reminded us about how important State Convention, Ludi, and SCRAM are for our organization..
- c. Regarding 2025 Convention, Woodbridge has offered its campus. He wants to make state events a true collaborative experience. Students and sponsors from different schools should come together. This promotes sustainability for the community, because, while some schools can’t host a physical event, they can run different aspects.
- d. Mr. Davis suggested the Constitution be updated for next year to require 50% of profit from both Ludi and SCRAM to go to the CAJCL scholarship fund.
 - i. This helps build reliability as an organization when finding donors. 50% of profit from State Convention goes to the scholarship fund already; we need to make that so for the other two events.
 - ii. Making this change to the Constitution means the hosting schools have one step less in the aftermath of the event. Ms. Alimento said that checks are often lost at schools, but Ms. Masoni responded that mailing a paper check is still the best option because digital money transfers charge an exorbitant rate.
 - iii. Ms. Alimento checked with Chase bank, the bank for the scholarship fund, and said she can accept ACH transfers without a charge.

- iv. Dr. Briggs suggested that some schools don't want to do electronics and prefer to cut checks. The payment methods should be flexible at this point.
- v. Mr. Muth asked other host schools if 50% of Ludi/SCRAM profits was the right number, since 50% of state profit is a much larger number.
 - a) Menlo School brought in around \$100,000, of which expenses took \$93,000, reaping a \$7,000 profit. Ludi/SCRAM get the same profit for a lot less work.
- vi. Dr. Briggs mentioned this would be a responsibility for Sachin, the 24-25 Parliamentarian.
- e. Mr. Davis thanked SCL, and said he loved the spirit they showed.
 - i. Kevin said they never gave gift cards/money to That's Entertainment winners from two years ago.
 - ii. Mr. Davis said he would deal with that and that, in future, cash was more feasible than gift cards.
 - iii. Dr. Briggs commented that he liked the small gifts given out this year instead of money.
- f. Regarding the Nationals scholarships, 12 students applied and Mr. Smith-Laird and he wanted to approve 11 recipients instead of the 10 that had been planned for.
 - i. Ms. Masoni wanted the board to keep overspending in mind in the future, since CAJCL spent more money this year than was collected. However, May is the high point of the fiscal year, and she doesn't see any issue with one extra scholarship.
 - a) Mr. Davis added that it was good to give out an extra scholarship this year to encourage a strong comeback from Covid, and that next year we might enforce the 10 recipient norm.
 - b) August called for a motion to approve the extra scholarship. Yoyo moved to approve. Felix seconded. The motion passed.
 - ii. Scholarship recipients must contact Ms. Masoni to prove they have registered before they receive their money.
- g. Ms. Masoni said an additional female chaperone was necessary for Nationals, and asked if the board would approve funding the travel and registration for this chaperone.
 - i. Mr. Smith Laird proposed a candidate, the parent of one of the students going. Dr. Briggs suggested finding a teacher, who has more authority. Ms. Masoni also agreed that a teacher is preferable, because teachers know how to interact with students they don't know and can provide more structure for the younger ones especially.
 - ii. Mrs. Vasquez suggested Holly Coty and offered to contact her.
 - iii. Felix moved to approve the expenditure. Mia seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- h. Ms. Vasquez asked who had the remaining officer pins from Convention. Patrick

said they might be in Ms. Jordt's room. She has to order more Northern/Southern representative pins anyways, but Patrick will look for the pins.

VII. Certamen Report – Brian Briggs

- a. Certamen went exceptionally well at CARCER and State.
 - i. 19 chapters were involved at Carcer, giving a total of 66 teams. Of these, 19 chapters went on to the next level, meaning there was broad representation of chapters in semifinals. 12 chapters were represented in the finals, which is great.
 - ii. He pointed out the recurring challenge of matching HS-1 teams with MS-2 teams. MS-2 can't have their own brackets, but they have considerably more experience.
 - a) Miles Hexun said the University Certamen teams wanted more recognition at Convention, because the winning teams weren't announced at GA III.
 - b) Mr. Davis suggested we give out the large rosettes at GA III and recognize the players as well.
- b. Dr. Briggs suggested the broken Certamen machines can be repaired over the summer, since NJCL does Certamen machine repairs.
 - i. Mr. Muth confirmed a machine is broken in the South.
 - ii. Ms. Masoni said NJCL wasn't accepting any new orders in order to clear the backlog. Dr. Briggs asks if we might approve fixing that machine when they are accepting repair requests. The repair will cost \$120. Ms. Masoni suggested we approve \$300 for that cost.
 - iii. Felix moved to approve the order. Franziska seconded. The motion passed.
- c. Dr. Briggs suggested starting Zoom Certamen practice before Nationals, and asked for a list of delegates to Nationals. Mr. Davis will get that list to him.
 - i. Ms. Vasquez asked if we should approach members from the winning teams at each level. Next year CAJCL might offer them scholarships for Nationals or reserve a portion of the scholarships given. Dr. Briggs agreed.
 - ii. Mr. Davis suggested someone might watch the final rounds to mark the contributions and/or specializations of each player.
 - iii. Miles added that he could get the team from University to go, as his team won first place 3 years in a row. Mr. Michalak agreed.
 - iv. Ms. Masoni suggested two candidates for Dr. Briggs intermediate team.
 - v. Ms. Vasquez suggested that Dr. Briggs reach out and not wait for students to contact him.
- d. Ms. Vasquez said that Open Certamen was well attended at Convention this year.
 - i. She always organized teams with only 3 players, so students can drop in.
 - ii. There were 4 rooms for Beginners, 1 room of 4 teams for Intermediate, and 4 rooms for advanced. Last year there were only 5 rooms in all, and

she had been wondering whether there was enough interest to continue with Open.

- iii. Electronic sign-ups worked very well, as did having a tech-savvy student to set up the program written by a former student, Sophie Reynolds '20.

VIII. SCL Report – Kevin Corrigan

- a. Kevin reported that there were 20 SCL members attending Convention.
 - i. Everything ran smoothly. Rain activities worked out in the end.
 - ii. He asked Patrick and Jackson whether SCL was supposed to run the Roman Rap Battle. Ms. Vasquez said they weren't. Her son Jordan ran it and his comment is that he should have had prizes, which the board agreed with. The event was jammed at Convention!
 - iii. *That's Entertainment* gave out non-cash prizes, including fancy plates, which delegates loved.
 - a) Dr. Briggs adored the prizes at *That's Entertainment*.
 - b) He suggested sponsors should get their seniors to sign up for SCL in whatever states they're in.
 - iv. They recruited 6-7 new SCL members, and should have a VP by the end of the month.
- b. Ms. Vasquez asked if he sent a report to the Convention Presidents with a list of what he needed. He is in the process of developing this list, and he will send it upon completion.
- c. The only supply issue was with volleyballs for the tournament. Evidently they didn't have access to the varsity balls, so they had to use deflated volleyballs.

IX. CAJCL Scholarship Report – Marisa Alimento

- a. CAJCL gave out 5 scholarships this year, and had 5 applicants. Before the next scholarship ad is released she wants to be clear how many scholarships can be reasonably paid out.
 - i. Paid out for Tim Abbott (St. Ignatius graduate) this year.
 - ii. Awaiting response from Mallika (Miramonte graduate). Mr. Davis said she has one more year to go in her program.
- b. She is expecting checks from Loyola (SCRAM, 2024), St. Francis (Ludi, 2024), and Crossroads (SCRAM, 2023).
- c. Ms. Alimento thought a Paypal donation link would be a good idea on the website. Mr. Davis agreed.
 - i. Ms. Alimento needs to research how a Paypal link would work and decide what account to connect it to. Then she can send it to the Webmaster.
 - ii. Ms. Masoni said CAJCL has a paypal already for accepting dues. She can provide proof that JCL is a non-profit organization to post on the website.

X. Treasurer Report ([LINK](#)) – Lisa Masoni

- a. Ms. Masoni reported that CAJCL has 1795 members, of which there are 7

members-at-large; and 45 chapters, of which 2 are new schools and 3 schools didn't renew from last year.

- i. Mr. Davis pointed out that membership is a bit low. Pre-Covid, CAJCL had 2,000-3,000 students. It is not necessary to raise dues by a dollar yet.
- b. The fiscal year ended May 1st.
 - i. The ending balance was \$21,549.18. The income was \$11,769.95. Expenditures were \$13,693.31.
 - ii. The 24-25 2nd VP budget for spirit is \$1,795. They will be reimbursed after Nationals.
- c. Some reimbursement checks from the board haven't been deposited yet. The board members said they would be deposited.
- d. She will file a tax statement over the summer.

XI. Next Meeting Date

- a. Mr. Davis Proposed Aug 24, but Baominh reminded the board that it will be an SAT test day.
- b. Depending on what day schools resume, the board might want to plan club stuff before school starts.
- c. Mr. Davis suggested the afternoon on the 25th. Dr. Briggs suggested September 7th. Ms. Masoni won't be there, but she can delegate someone to take down reimbursement requests.
- d. All members must check with school, sponsor, and family to make sure they can make it to the meeting on September 7.
- e. Yoyo moved to approve this date. Baominh seconded. The motion passed.

XII. New Business

- a. August called for new business, especially from the new board.
 - i. Baominh confirmed SCRAM is set for November 16th. They are assembling students, parents, and teachers to volunteer. Miles offered to help run academics with University. Ms. Alimento said Crossroads could help with graphic arts. John Conant said Woodbridge can also help.
 - ii. Ludi will be October 26th.
 - iii. Mr. Davis said he would meet with adults to break down events and see where people can help with different things at the State Convention..
- b. Dr. Briggs asked if they had chosen the t-shirt for Nationals. Yoyo will send something out to the group so they can vote on which t-shirt they want.
- c. Mr. Davis said all emails should be transferred to the new board by June 1st. The emails for Northern Rep and Southern Rep can be transferred now.
 - i. Dr. Briggs reminded the 2023-24 board to save documents etc to their drives.
 - ii. The email transfer must occur after National submissions.
- d. Mr. John Conant asked how he and his student can get on the email list for future

meetings. Mr. Davis said he would work with the webmaster to do that.

- XIII. Picture/Screenshot for the Scrapbook** – Mia DaPonte took a screenshot of the Zoom for the scrapbook.
