Academic Events Information:

Tests: All students must take one test, but may take up to two. The testing subjects include: Daily Life, Derivatives, Mythology, Vocabulary, Grammar, and Reading Comprehension.

Colloquia: All delegates are required to attend two Colloquia sessions.

Certamen: Open certamen will include novice, intermediate, and advanced levels. We will send a link for certamen sign ups one week before Ludi Octobres.

Please remind students that (1) they are not allowed to leave campus at any time during Ludi; (2) the use of alcohol, weapons, cigarettes, or drugs is, of course, prohibited.
